The preferred options phase of the Breckland Local Plan will launch on Monday 3rd June and close on Monday 15th July. Breckland Council have launched a new £300K grant to support the district's health and wellbeing. The grant scheme will see funding released in rounds over the coming three years, ensuring a fair opportunity for current and future projects, and regular investment into Breckland communities between now and 2027. The scheme is delivered by Norfolk Community Foundation, on behalf of Breckland Council.

The first round of applications are now open, with successful applicants given up to £5,000 each to help them deliver their projects alongside other funding sources. Eligible applicants include local community groups and sports clubs, parish councils and community interest companies which are looking to make a difference in their area.
